

GIORGIO OLIVIERI

(Verona, Italy 1937-2017)

Artistic activity

Born in Verona where he lives and works. He began exhibiting at the end of the 1950s, taking part in shows and exhibitions in Italy and abroad.

He developed his research in the sphere of non-objective painting, becoming an interpreter, right from his early years, of that climate of aniconic resetting that follows the hot wave of informal action and that privileges painting as an analytical procedure, an investigation around its tools, signs, syntax and specificity.

In 1979 and 1983 he was mentioned in the Bolaffi painting catalogue by Guido Ballo, Giuseppe Marchiori and Giorgio Cortenova. He appears in Lara Vinca Masini's Dictionary of Contemporary Art, in Storia dell'Arte Italiana (Electa), in Benezit's Dictionary of Painters and Sculptors, in Arte Contemporanea (De Agostini), in C. Cerritelli's Pittura Aniconica (Mazzotta) and in numerous other publications.
